




The Doorways is an independent, non-profit 501(c)(3) organization operating in a 117-room former hotel. We were originally founded in 1983 as the Hospital Hospitality House of Richmond, a small, nonprofit medical lodging program designed to serve family members of patients in the hospitals in downtown Richmond. Today, we are one of the largest donation-funded hospital hospitality houses in the country, annually providing more than 60,000 nights of lodging to more than 10,000 individuals. to reducing disparities and obstacles to healthcare access for the medically underserved. financially disadvantaged, and individuals facing difficulty obtaining necessary care within their communities.

MISSION IN ACTION

- 89% of guests said staying at The Doorways had a positive impact on their emotional wellbeing.
- **85% of guests said staying at The Doorways helped their family avoid financial distress.
- 45% of guests said the cost savings from staying at The Doorways helped their family avoid eviction from, or foreclosure on, their home.

James knew it wouldn't be possible to drive back and forth from Roanoke, Virginia each day while supporting his wife, Sharon, through her liver transplant. Yet the cost of hotels in Richmond would be exorbitant for their two month stay. They had "no other option" until hearing about The Doorways, which became their "home away from home." James became a regular attendee of our Transplant Support Group while Sharon recuperated at VCU Health. He brought a very special



guest who was welcomed with open arms at his last group meeting – his beloved wife, having just been discharged from Sheltering Arms Institute! For James, The Doorways goes beyond "having all the amenities you can think of and everyone going out of their way to help you," it meant "being with Sharon through all of this. I can't tell you how much it means to me."

ary arrived earlier than her coworkers for their volunteer shift with a specific purpose – to take a moment to relive her time as a guest here nearly 10 years ago while her husband received treatment at VCU Health for a rare blood disease.

Mary has held The Doorways close to her heart ever since – but never anticipated being able to flip the script and serve dinner to guests herself. But when her supervisor at C&F Bank became a Board Member of The Doorways and asked colleagues to volunteer with him, he didn't realize that this is where Mary stayed all those years ago. Coming back was extremely emotional for Mary, but she felt compelled to give back to a place that gave her so much. She recalls that staying at The Doorways felt "normal" and simple acts like borrowing books from the library or playing rounds of bingo in the evening were the "distractions [she] needed from the illness."

For Mary, serving dinner to guests isn't just about remembering her time here with her husband, it's a way to honor the friendships she formed during her stay by now supporting current guests. As Mary would tell you, being involved with The Doorways is "more powerful than you can imagine" because our mission goes beyond just having a place to stay: it's a place where community lasts a lifetime thanks to the support of people like Mary, and like each of our donors.

The Doorways was founded in 1983 by a group of dedicated volunteers at the MCV Hospital Auxiliary who believed that caregivers deserved more than sleeping in hospital waiting rooms and eating meals from vending machines. All these years later, volunteers remain vital to the success of our mission. The support they provide our guests is invaluable: they create a sense of community with home-cooked meals, support groups, music for our guests, maintaining a clean environment, decorating for festivities, and being a listening ear. We welcome volunteers from school groups, large corporations, small businesses, religious organizations, civic groups, solo guest chefs, groups of friends and family, even former guests! From practical assistance to emotional comfort, each volunteer makes our house feel more like a home.




FISCAL YEAR 2023 FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT | July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023
